

REWARD

Kenneth Michael Trentadue was tortured and murdered in August 1995, while incarcerated at the Federal Transfer Center in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. He was strangled with plastic handcuffs or “flexicuffs.” Kenneth Trentadue’s family believes that he was murdered by agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Below is a photograph taken by the Oklahoma Medical Examiner’s Office of Kenneth Trentadue’s neck. This photograph depicts the groove or furrow left on Kenneth’s neck by the ligature and clearly shows the cross-tie like impressions caused by the locking mechanism of the plastic handcuffs.



The Family of Kenneth Michael Trentadue will pay, strictly subject to the terms and conditions set forth herein below, a reward of Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00) to the person who provides new evidence resulting in final felony murder convictions of those who committed this crime. If felony murder charges are brought against the people responsible for this crime, the \$250,000.00 reward will be place into an escrow account, but the reward shall only be paid after judgments of conviction are entered and become final.

One reward of \$250,000.00 shall be paid regardless of the number of persons convicted. In the event two or more people submit the same evidence, the person first doing so shall be entitled to the entire reward. If there is a dispute about which evidence resulted in convictions, the head prosecutor on the case shall designate the claimant entitled to the reward, which shall be binding.
